MESSAGE FROM OUR MAYOR



This time of year is always very busy for us here at Council as we finalise budgets and plans that will help set us up to build a better Manningham for now and the future. We adopted our 2022/23 Budget and 10 Year Financial Plan at our June Council Meeting.

This budget and plan will support more than 100 valuable services and ensure we deliver for our community.

Our budget will enable us to:

- Deliver a \$65.2 million capital works program to maintain and enhance Council's \$2 billion worth of community assets and **build a better Manningham.**
- **Take action** with several new key initiatives in priority areas, including \$1.5 million in our 2022/23 Budget towards delivering climate change actions.
- **Plan for our future** with a range of strategic programs and projects including allocating \$50 million over the next 10 years for major community facilities.

While we deliver for future years, we are conscious of the challenging economic environment and are keeping our average general rate increase to below inflation and in line with the State Government's rate cap of 1.75 per cent.

Through our consultation with community, the budget is focused on the key priorities that you told us were important for you and your family. Read more at manningham.vic.gov.au/budget

We continue our advocacy to the State and Federal governments to get a headspace youth mental health service in Manningham.

While we welcome the recent Federal Government commitment of \$1 million a year for four years for a headspace service in the Menzies/Chisholm area, we want this service to be based here in Manningham.

Our young people need mental health support, and they need it to be easily accessible.

Demand for youth mental health services have increased by 48% in the past year and suicide is the leading cause of death for our 15 to 24 year olds. This crisis has gone on long enough and we need to respond as a community to call for a local headspace.

We've had a great response from our young people, parents and the community, who have helped raise awareness of the mental health crisis our young people face. As part of our #manninghamneedsheadspace advocacy campaign, there has been info stalls around Manningham where many people have shared their stories and experiences with us. We'll be taking this back to Government as we advocate for Manningham to get a headspace.

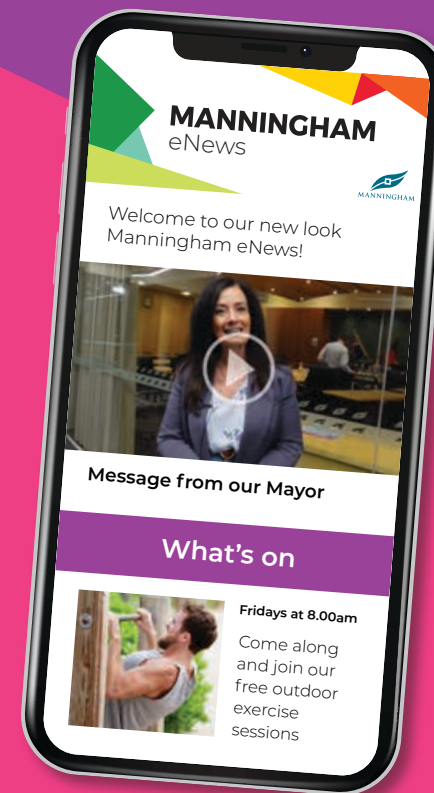

Supported transport trial for older adults

We are trialling a Supported Transport bus service during 2022. The service will assist our older residents to travel to destinations around Manningham, like local shopping centres and community centres to assist with essential shopping needs and attend activities to stay connected with others in the community.

To be eligible, you will need to be:

- a resident of Manningham
- over 65 years of age (over 50 years for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people)
- assessed as transport or mobility disadvantaged.

The service operates Monday to Friday and passengers are charged a fee of \$6.70 per day.

Throughout the trial, we will review customer feedback and information about usage patterns.

There will be times when we may not meet all requests for the service. The information will help us improve the service for the future.

A new masterplan for Anderson Park

Earlier this year you shared your thoughts on our draft masterplan for Anderson Park in Doncaster East.

We've listened to your comments and have now endorsed the new masterplan. The plan outlines key actions for the reserve which will benefit the community and sporting clubs, including:

- upgrades to soccer facilities, including converting the southern pitch to synthetic, floodlight upgrades, upgrading the northern pitch with natural turf, and more
- constructing a path network around the reserve to improve connectivity
- a new local level playground
- retention and enhancement of the bushland areas.

Make sure you are ready for winter weather

In June last year a large storm event created power outages and fallen trees across Manningham. As the colder months are fast approaching, preparing for a storm events is important. There's lots of online resources to help you. Take some time to sit down with your household and make sure you're well equipped to deal with storms that might arise.

Emergency Prepare is an excellent all in one source of information that provides information for storm, home fire safety and utility outages. Many tools such as quizzes, videos and more resources can help you prepare.

The State Emergency Service has great information on preparing your home and property and understanding flood information for your local area.

During winter the risk of fire increases inside the home as we are all using more appliances to stay warm. Download the Home Fire Safety Booklet from Fire Rescue Victoria to find out how you can stay safe.

What should you do if a power outage occurs? Check your neighbour's house to see if they have also lost power. If your neighbour has power on, then check to see if your safety switch has tripped.

Check your electricity distributor's website to get an estimate time until power is restored.

Turn off appliances to protect them from a power surge when power is restored. It is a good idea to keep one light switched on so you know when the power is back on.

If you have your own portable generator then knowing how to safely operate it is a must. Use portable generators with care as they pose safety risks if they are used incorrectly. These can include electrocution, fire or even asphyxiation. Generators must be in well ventilated areas - never indoors or in enclosed areas as they emit carbon monoxide that you cannot see or smell.

A facelift for Montgomery Reserve

Montgomery Reserve in Doncaster East has been revitalised. We wanted to make sure this open space caters to a diverse range of park users and meets the needs of the local community into the future.

Officially opened in March by Sonja Terpstra MLC and Mayor Cr Michelle Kleinert, the project was funded by Council with support from the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program. We also secured State Government funding towards the project from the Local Parks Program: Park Revitalisation Grant from the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning.

After receiving community feedback, the park upgrade includes:

- new play elements (spinner, climber equipment and a bird's nest swing)
- rocks and logs for nature play
- a plaza area with a range of seating options
- sandstone retaining walls and boulders for climbing and sitting
- a banquet picnic table and picnic shelter
- new tree and shrub planting including a sensory garden along the southern boundary.

Living independently with an intellectual disability

Living independently and making our own choices is key to one's wellbeing, but for some in our community this can be a challenge.

Pines Learning recently ran a 40 hour hands on independent living course for people with an intellectual disability.

Funded through Council's Community Grants program, Pines Learning partnered with Manningham Inclusive Community Housing Inc. (MICH) to help those planning to or are currently living independently.

The course covered:

- building relationships
- house rules
- personal safety
- appliances
- cleaning
- first aid
- family planning
- banking
- building community connections and other important skills.

MICH also ran sessions for parents so they could feel confident as their loved one moved out of the family home.

Participants were congratulated on their achievements at the completion of the program.

Mayor Cr Michelle Kleinert, and Cr Anna Chen joined parents, friends, carers, MICH and Pines Learning representatives to celebrate.

We're delivering for you

Our 2022/23 Budget is delivering for our community. With an operating budget of \$138 million to deliver more than 100 valuable services. We are keeping the impact on our community to below inflation and in line with the State Government's rate cap of 1.75%.

We are **building a better Manningham** with a \$65.2 million capital works program to maintain and enhance Council's \$2 billion of community assets with a focus on funding to deliver:

- our drainage program to protect our environment
- building better connections through our roads and bridges program
- creating better pedestrian links and expanding our footpaths and cycleways
- improving the amenity (appearance) of our city
- enhancing our parks and reserves
- renewing and upgrading community facilities including environmentally sustainable design.

We are **taking action** with a number of new key operating initiatives in priority areas, including delivering on:

- our Climate Emergency Action Plan to reduce the impacts of climate change
- waste management initiatives such as Food Organics Garden Organics (FOGO) to reduce the amount of waste going to landfill
- supporting community led initiatives through our extensive community grants program
- support for local business and employment including support for business hubs and co-working spaces
- improved transport
- advocacy for youth mental health services
- an increase in the operating hours of our Doncaster and The Pines libraries to meet demand.

We are **planning for our future**, by:

- allocating \$50 million over the next 10 years for new and significantly upgraded major community facilities
- strategically unlocking the potential of our assets to improve our financial sustainability
- working to understand our water and flood management challenges and develop ways to address risk to public and private property
- delivering on our Liveable City Strategy to create vibrant activity centres and community places, promote more jobs in the suburbs, encourage housing and transport choice, and protect Manningham's valued landscape character.

Here's some of the works this budget will deliver:

JUMPING CREEK ROAD UPGRADE

We have allocated \$1.8 million in our 2022/23 Budget towards our continued work to upgrade Jumping Creek Road.

We completed the first section of the upgrade in 2020 and now have detailed designs for the final stage.

This work is part of our commitment to build a better Manningham and will improve the safe connection between Warrandyte, Wonga Park and surrounding areas.

MACEDON SQUARE UPGRADE

We have allocated \$1.2 million in our 2022/23 Budget to upgrade Macedon Square in Templestowe Lower as part of our commitment to build a better Manningham.

The upgrade will deliver safety improvements while maintaining the look and feel of the shopping precinct.

The upgrade will support our thriving local economy and improve the liveability of Manningham's places and spaces.

FLOOD AND STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

We have allocated \$270,000 in our 2022/23 Budget towards our Flood and Stormwater Management planning.

This work is part of our commitment to plan for the future and will help us better understand the increasing flooding and stormwater management challenges related to climate change, development pressure and population growth.

We are establishing a Community Reference Panel to help us deliver expert advice and consultation on the impact of flood and stormwater management to contribute to the long-term sustainability, resilience and liveability of Manningham.

CLIMATE EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN

We have allocated \$1.5 million in our 2022/23 Budget towards delivering actions in our Climate Emergency Action Plan as part of our commitment to address the growing risks and impacts of climate change on our community.

The funding will go towards:

- rooftop solar installations at seven Council buildings
- flood mapping
- a review of areas of biological significance
- development of a public electric vehicle charging trial
- an expanded residential solar program.

FOOD ORGANICS GARDEN ORGANICS (FOGO)

We have allocated \$2.5 million in our 2022/23 Budget towards our aggregated waste initiatives including Food Organics Garden Organics (FOGO) as part of our commitment to take action on climate change and achieve our climate targets.

FOGO will mean changes to household waste collection services starting in July 2023, when green lid garden bins will be collected weekly and include both food waste and garden waste. Red lid garbage bins will be collected fortnightly.

Jumping Creek Road upgrade plan endorsed by Council

The Jumping Creek Road Design Proposal was endorsed by Council on Tuesday 26 April.

The design proposal outlines how the project will be constructed and successfully balances the priorities of safe road usage with minimising impact on the area around the road.

The upgrade will include:

- An upgrade to the Wonga Park Township intersection (Dudley Road and Jumping Creek Road), including traffic lights.
- Installing an underground drainage system, including kerb and channel, along the entire road.
- New roundabouts at Hooper and Hartley roads.
- A recreational trail on the northern side of the road.
- Extensive revegetation along the entire Jumping Creek Road corridor.
- Installations of aerial and wildlife crossings to protect wildlife.

The upgrade is vital to improve safety for many of our community who use the road to travel to home, work, school and social connections.

Jumping Creek Road carries more than 8,100 vehicles per day, with the traffic volume expected to increase to 15,000 vehicles per day by 2035.

The next phase of major works is expected to begin in early 2023, with some works starting in late 2022.

Our young people need accessible mental health support. Demand for youth mental health services has increased by 48% in the past year and suicide is the leading cause of death for our 15 to 24 year olds. We need to respond as a community to this crisis to call for a local headspace.

“Having a headspace in Manningham will ensure our young people can access mental health services without transport barriers,” said Mayor Cr Michelle Kleinert.

We have had a great response from our young people, their parents and community to our #manninghamneedsheadspace advocacy campaign. Thank you for raising awareness for our lack of services and calling for a local headspace.

From our engagements young people have told us to focus on raising awareness through schools, hosting information stalls and posting on social media. We are shaping the #manninghamneedsheadspace campaign to the voices of our young people.

We also held info stalls around Manningham with some fun games, prizes, and freebies. You've joined us at MC Square, Westfield Doncaster, Bunnings Doncaster, and Warrandyte Market.

When asked, “Why is good mental health important to you?” you said:

- “[It] impacts on all aspects of life. Good mental health = happier brains!”
- “It helps me maintain relationships and stay afloat with school.”
- “[It] helps me feel more comfortable as me.”

Overwhelmingly, “it helps with motivation” was the most popular response demonstrating our collective need for additional mental health support, especially among our young people.

You've shared your personal experiences with us on Your Say, our survey, and through our 'stories box' at our information stalls. We'll be taking this data directly back to the Government as we advocate for Manningham to be the home of the new headspace service.

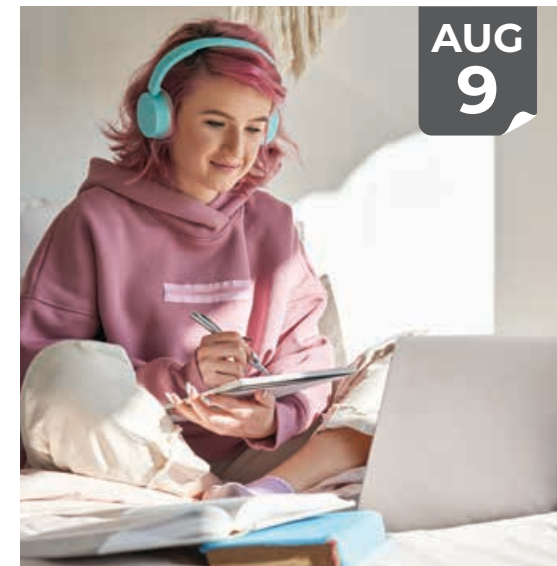
